### Family Retreat at Bassenthwaite

We hold our winter Family Retreat at Bassenfell Manor in the northern Lake District. It is a

The worst thing about the weekend is that it is far too short. Arriving on the Friday evening, we have about enough time to eat, reconnect with each other in the *Pilgrims' Retreat* and settle in for our stay.

Saturday starts with morning devotions in the lounge, followed by a hearty breakfast in the dining room overlooking the lake. We then enjoy a couple of teaching sessions in the conference room which this year were led by **Steve Whitehead** and a sample video lesson from our up and coming video learning project, *The Book Programme*. There are sessions and activities for the younger ones too, as one would expect at

## Study Weekends

We live in an age of instant information where even the most obscure fact can easily be verified around the dinner table by use of the internet. We are surrounded by all sorts of knowledge and data through an abundance of devices we might have scattered about our homes. But in the big scheme of things, no learning experience can compare with the dynamics of a live classroom environment in which people interact with real people.

Along with this personal interaction, a classroom environment provides opportunities for better affirmation of truth and

understanding of concepts - both essential to the learning process - than might be gained through less traditional teaching models. This is why we see our Study Weekends as being such an important part of our work, along with our annual Study Week in November, where we can offer structured learning in line with our established curriculum.

This Spring we offered three modules in various locations within the UK. We have taken Ephesians to **Great Barr** in Birmingham, Galatians to **Northampton**, and Hebrews to **Aberdeen**. Each of these has been taught over two intensive weekends, about a month apart, by teachers with years of experience in both the word and the classroom. It would be very fair to say that those who attended were engaged, challenged and encouraged by these events.

## Distance Learning updates

Our Distance Learning Programme has taken a little bit of a back seat in recent times whilst we have been focusing on other matters. There are a number of areas in need of improvement in order to make access more relevant in current times. As we continue to develop The Book Programme, we are looking at ways in which we might better integrate these two areas of our work without unnecessary duplication.

However, we are still receiving new applications and are very happy to say that we have a number of students who continue to be active with our introductory modules. One student who recently completed the first Module has now begun on the second, and a handful of new students have enrolled. Details are on our website, which itself is in need of a major overhaul - budget permitting!

## Mobile library?

For quite some time now we have been in the process of

restructuring the workings of the British Bible School, and this process is now hopefully nearing some sort of completion. Long ago, back in 1979, the school began in Corby under the oversight of the leadership of the local congregation. In more recent times the school has become more independent, and has been run by a board of governors – all of whom have been actively involved in the work of the school.

The school will continue to be run in a similar fashion, though we are looking at ways in which we might become more accountable and even better representative of those whom we seek to serve. We ask that you might be mindful of these things in prayer, and look out for news of further developments.

One more noticeable change in recent times has been the slimming down and moving of the BBS library. Since the suspension of our residential programme a number of years ago, the library has been little used, largely due to its location. There was a need to move the books from where they had been living to a new location, whilst at the same time keeping hold of only those books which were likely to be useful.

Having significantly pruned the contents, most surplus volumes have been left for any who might yet wish to make use of them. A number are still available for purchase, and are being made available during our study events, whilst the core library has been cleaned and is now housed and being maintained at Northampton.

Students wishing to make use of our library now have better access to it as it now enjoys a new lease of life.

# Later this year ...

Plans are in full swing for what looks like another rather busy second half of the year. We have an expanded schedule of Study Weekends this autumn, along with our Residential Study Week in the Lake District and, of course, our Autumn Family Retreat in Norfolk.

## More Study Events

Our **Study Weekends** are intended to provide short, but intensive and focused periods of Bible teaching. We aim to cover the essentials of one of the Modules from our Applied Biblical Studies course over two weekend periods, within a classroom environment. As part of a well-structured curriculum, there is also opportunity for students to gain credit towards British Bible School study awards.

A typical series of BBS Study Weekends will provide:

- ▶ Sixteen hours of classroom teaching
- ▶ Experienced teachers with many years devoted to studying Scripture
- ▶ An encouraging and challenging atmosphere of questioning and learning

Later this year we will be returning to **Wembley** in North London with our Module on the New Testament letter to the Galatians. We will be taking the prophet Ezekiel to **East Kilbride** in Scotland. And then we will be conducting our first classes in **Morley**, near Leeds, on Paul's letter to the believers in Ephesus. You will find dates above, and details on our website.

We are again rather excited about our **Autumn Study Week**

which is to be held at Bassenfell Manor, in the Lake District - the same venue in which we hold our Late Winter Family Retreat. This year we shall be presenting our module on: *The Deliverance of Israel* in which we will be studying the books of **Judges and Ruth**.

Continuing one of the most exciting episodes of Israel's history, from the time of Joshua to that of Samuel. This module examines the books of Judges and Ruth in the contexts of the history of Israel and of God's purpose for the whole of mankind, considering also the relevance of its message in light of contemporary events and culture.

This is an excellent opportunity to study one of our Old Testament modules forming part of our Applied Biblical Studies course. You can find full details on our website, along with a syllabus you can download. Students working towards a British Bible School award will receive five Module Credits upon completion of all given assignments.

## Production filming

Work is continuing to progress with production of *The Book Programme*, though things have been somewhat held back due to the relocation of our library and building works at our 'film studio'. However, things now seem to be sorted and filming is due to recommence within a couple of weeks.
