

# BBS Study Weekend Syllabus

## Hebrews (NEW15)



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### Overview

One of the most significant books in the New Testament in helping us understand the work of Christ in the context of the calling of Israel. Here we take a thorough look at the arguments presented for the supremacy of Christ – as useful today as when first written.

This is one of our New Testament Modules forming part of our *Applied Biblical Studies* course. Students working towards a British Bible School award will receive 5 Module Credits upon completion of all given assignments.

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### Module content

- This module will introduce students to the New Testament book of Hebrews in its original context, with a view to understanding its message and relevance within a contemporary setting.
- The issue of authorship and its significance will be discussed along with consideration of the document's initial destination.
- The text will be explored on a sectional basis and in light of its context within the message of the document as a whole, never losing sight of the supremacy of Christ as its central theme.
- The subjects of priesthood, worship and sacrifice will be explored as they relate to the contents of the document and to the Hebrew Scriptures.
- Other major Biblical themes addressed within the book, such as faith, grace, suffering and holiness will be explored with a view to better understanding these universal themes as they reveal truth about God.

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## Learning outcomes

On successful completion of this module the student will:

- be familiar with the structure and contents of this book, as distinct from other Scripture
- have a good grasp of the essential message of the document and of its place within the whole story of God
- recognise its particular significance and relevance for believers today
- better understand the relevance of a number of significant Biblical themes, particularly those unique to this book
- better understand the Hebrew Scriptures in relation to the life and sacrifice of Christ.

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## Additional assignments

These are optional but are required for those wishing to complete all Learning outcomes and attain Module credit towards a British Bible School award.

1. Attend all sessions of the Study Event\*
2. Make a list of at least a dozen things we learn about Christ from this book, preferable things we don't learn or are not emphasised elsewhere, and suggest why they might be important to our faith. Include appropriate references.
3. Choose six quotations made in "Hebrews" from the Hebrew Scriptures, briefly explain their original context and meaning, and comment on how that might be reflected in this book.
4. Write a 2,000 word article/essay on any **one** of the following:\*\*
  - a. The text of the Hebrew Scriptures in the book of Hebrews
  - b. The contribution of Melchizedek to our faith in Christ
  - c. How "Hebrews" has helped me better understand the Old Testament Scriptures
  - d. To what degree are the 'warnings' in this document applicable to believers today?
  - e. How might we best demonstrate the supremacy of Christ within a contemporary pluralistic society?
  - f. The canonicity of the book of Hebrews.

Assignments should generally be submitted within six months of the completion of class sessions.
